## Clay's Notes

Here's a caddis larva pattern that trout won't be able to resist. The subtle, flashy underbody will get attention every time. Fish it during the summer months when caddis are on the minds of trout. It is an excellent searching pattern when nothing seems to be hatching. Get it down close to the bottom on a drag free drift and get ready to set the hook.

<b>Hook:</b>	<b>Scud hook #10-#18 (TMC 2487 or the heavier 2457)</b>
<b>Thread:</b>	<b>Black</b>
<b>Rib:</b>	<b>Mylar Flash</b>
<b>Body:</b>	<b>Green and Chartreuse Antron mixed with Fire-Star Caddis Mylar dubbing (chartreuse ice dubbing)</b>
<b>Wing Pads:</b>	<b>Mallard</b>
<b>Legs:</b>	<b>Partridge</b>
<b>Thorax:</b>	<b>Black Ostrich Herl</b>
<b>Antenna:</b>	<b>Wood Duck Flank</b>
