The Epeorus is the most important mayfly emergence on the Madison River below Quake Lake. The nymphs are clingers, hanging tightly to the bottom of rocks in the heaviest flows of the river. As they migrate into shore to emerge, they become available to trout.

<u>Epeorus Nymph Tying Recipe – (From Schwiebert's Matching the Hatch)</u>

Abdomen: Rabbit and red fox fur mixed

Thorax: Beaver dubbing

Wing case: Brown mottled turkey feather Legs: Brown partridge hackle fibers

Tails: Two wood-duck flank fibers (I use more)

Ribbing: Trimmed brown saddle hackle trimmed off on belly and back

Silk: Black
