If you haven't learned by now I am a big fan of Rene Harrop and his fly creations. They are available through Solitude Flies and online at Anderson's Yellowstone Angler. The last Chance Cripple is one of my favorites. I use this pattern for Baetis, PMD's, the March Brown and the Epeorus hatches. I use this pattern as a point fly and trail a floating nymph or a soft hackle behind it. They really work.

Last Chance Cripple Fly Tying Recipe (BWO Version)

Hook:	Daiichi 1100 or Tiemco 100 size 16 to 22
Thread:	Tiemco 16/0
Shuck:	Spirit River Sparkle Yarn, Darlon, or Z-Lon
Tail:	Wood Duck or Mallard Dyed Wood Duck
Abdomen:	Stripped Peacock Herl, Turkey Biots, or Thread and Wire
Wing:	2-3 matched CDC feathers
Thorax:	Nature's Spirit Fine Natural Dubbing, Nature's Spirit Emergence Dubbing, or Wapsi Superfine Dubbing
Hackle:	Dun Dry Fly Hackle
