## Clay's Notes

Pete Hidy coined the term, *flymph*, which refers to wingless wet flies. They represent insects that are not yet flies but no longer nymphs – hence the name *Flymphs*. The March Brown Flymph fishes for both the emerging nymph and the drowned dun of the march brown mayfly. You can fish this just under the surface, as a dry-dropper or swing it.

### March Brown Flymph Tying Recipe

**Hook:** Standard Wet Fly, Sizes 10-16  
**Thread:** Red Pearsall's Gossamer silk or 6/0  
**Hackle:** Furnace Brown  
**Tails:** Furnace or Brown Hen  
**Body:** Hare's mask fur
