Clay's Notes

The Hackle Stacker is a mayfly emerger pattern. It can be used to imitate a Yellow Sally Stonefly when tied in yellow hues. It utilizes a paraloop method of wrapping hackles around a looped monofilament and bringing the monofilament over a dubbed thorax to a tie-off location just behind the eye. The result is a group of hackles residing upon the top of the thorax keeping the hackles well above the hook shank. This allows the fly to submerge itself well into the surface film and results in better hook-ups due to the hook placement being lower in the water.

Hook:	Daiichi 1180 #10-24
Thread:	Light Yellow Uni 8/0
Tail:	Grizzly
Abdomen:	Light Yellow super fine dubbing
Hackle:	Grizzly rooster hackle
Loop:	Tying thread
Thorax:	Light Yellow superfine dubbing
