This pattern, typically swung or fished like a traditional wet fly, has a great deal of movement and action in the water. It is a favorite of many an angler for trout, steelhead, salmon and more. Though most people swing the Chubby Cousin, you can also nymph or dead drift it.

Hook: TMC 5262 or any other nymph hooks # 16 - # 14

Thread: 6/0 red
Bead: Gold
Ribbing: Gold

Dubbing: Ice **Dub Peacock**

Hackle: Mallard flank or partridge feather

Legs: Tarantu-Legs Tan

UV Resin: Deer Creek Diamond Fine
